Sir: Herewith I transmit report of small arms practice for season 1906.

Increased interest has been manifested, as shown by return from home range practice, but the figure of merit of the guard as a whole is much too low.

The eight medals offered by the Adjutant General for individual record of enlisted men created much interest during the summer camp, and resulted in many excellent scores.

The 600-yard match was an absolute tie between Corporal Louis D. Harley, of Company "I," First Infantry, and Private Arthur Gross, of Company "G," of the same regiment, and there has been no opportunity to shoot off the tie.

Judge E. W. Bazille and Dr. J. C. Nelson, of St. Paul, have united in giving a handsome cup for competition between the companies stationed at St. Paul, and on October 7, 1906, teams of ten men from Companies "C," "D" and "E" of the First Infantry and Company "E" of the Third Infantry engaged in their annual competition for this cup on the range of Company "I," First Infantry.

A detailed report of the match by Lieutenant Colonel Frank T. Corriston, who acted as officer in charge of the match, accompanies this report.

If public-spirited citizens would organize more of such inter-company matches it would greatly increase the interest and efficiency of local companies.

CIRCULAR NO. 1.

June 5, 1906.

The following is published for the information of all concerned:
DIRECTIONS FOR SECURING HAVERSACK HOOKS, NEW MODEL, TO D-RINGS OF HAVERSACK, AND FOR ASSEMBLING CANTEEN AND HAVERSACK ON RIFLE CARTRIDGE BELT, MODEL (1903).

Place the smaller hooks through the D-ring of the haversack and close down by light blows of a hammer, or pressure with a pair of tweezers, until the D-ring cannot escape from the hook.

Engage the larger hook in the lower eyelets in the belt. Hook the canteen strap into the triangles on the canteen and the snap into an eye of the cartridge belt. Assemble suspenders and hook into upper eyelets of belt.

In adjusting suspenders and waist belt to the man, care should be taken to see that the waist belt is high enough. It is intended to rest over the pit of the stomach, and thus reduce as much as possible the pressure on the abdomen.
