CIRCULAR
No. 1.

The following rules will govern in the preparation of pay rolls by regimental and battalion adjutants, and company and battery commanders for service during the encampments as published in General Orders No. 5, c. s., from these headquarters:

1. The full strength of your organization, whether present or absent, must appear on the rolls.
2. Before leaving your home station, you will have the rolls completed under the first three headings, viz., "Name," "Grade," "Date of Enlistment," and "Rank" in case of officers.
3. The instructions for the preparation of pay rolls as given on page 1, Form No. 3, Militia, must be strictly complied with.
4. Have each member of your company sign the pay rolls on his completion of five days camp service.
5. The pay roll intended for your retained copy (which will be one of Form No. 20) will be handed into general headquarters on your arrival in camp.

Blank pay rolls, five in number, have been mailed to your address.

GENERAL ORDERS
No. 1.

Hereafter the original copy of all enlistment papers of men enlisting or re-enlisting in the Minnesota National Guard, will be sent direct to the Adjutant General of the State, St. Paul, Minn., as soon as completed. Form for the physical examination of a recruit (Form 2-A) *must* be prepared and forwarded with all original enlistment papers. Duplicate copies will continue to be forwarded to regimental headquarters with monthly reports.

When a man re-enlists immediately upon expiration of his enlistment or within thirty days thereafter, the physical examination paper, Form 2-A, need not be used. Instead of it, the recruiting officer will examine the man, fill in "Physical Record" on Enlistment Paper, Form 2, and certify under remarks that he is satisfied that the man's physical condition remains unimpaired.

In all cases where a man who has previously served in the Guard desires again to join the service but has been out for more than thirty days, his re-entrance constitutes an original enlistment and recruiting officers must prepare papers accordingly. In such cases as well as re-enlistments, special care must be taken to enter any previous military service in proper place on Form 2.

Whenever the consent of parent or guardian is required, in case of minors, the papers must be carefully filled in and signatures duly witnessed.

Sizes of clothing, etc., must be carefully filled in, both in case of enlistments and re-enlistments.

1. The following communication from the War Department to the Governor of Minnesota, is published for the information of the Minnesota National Guard:

“War Department, Washington,
January 7, 1908.”

“Sir:—In view of the present and prospective vacancies in the grade of 2d Lieutenant in the Army over and above those required by law for the graduates of the United States Military Academy and the enlisted men of the regular Army, I am authorized by the President to inform you that he will be pleased to name for competition in July next a candidate to be named by you from among members of the organized militia of Minnesota. This candidate will be authorized to compete with other civilian candidates for a limited number of vacancies under regulations prescribed by the War Department in General Orders inclosed herewith. This order gives in detail the requirements of the examination and all information needed by candidates in advance to enable them to prepare themselves. The following fundamental rules of eligibility are laid down by the Department in conformity with existing regulations, and in order to secure uniformity among candidates who shall be named by the various governors in response to this invitation.

The candidate must be unmarried; must not be less than 21 years of age or more than 27; must be a citizen of the United States; must be physically qualified to discharge all the duties of an officer in active service; must be free from mental or bodily deformity and of good moral character and habits; must have been a member of the organized militia of your State continuously for not less than two years prior to being named by you, and must have the favorable recommendation of the commanding officer of his immediate organization and of the regimental and brigade commanders when the same exist and are his direct superiors. The candidate, whether officer or enlisted man, may be of any grade.

Early action is urged to the end that the candidate named may have as much time as possible for preparation.
