# MN NATIONAL GUARD EDUCATION BENEFITS 101

- 1. **Federal Tuition Assistance**: Federal Tuition Assistance (FTA) is a **federally funded** program paid directly to the school.
  - **FUNDING LEVEL:** FTA will fund up to 100% of tuition; up to \$250.00 per semester credit or \$167.00 per quarter credit, with a maximum of 16 credits per military fiscal year. Lifetime caps are 130 undergraduate credits and 39 graduate credits and 21 certificate credits. To apply for FTA go to www.armyignited.army.mil
  - ELIGIBILITY: Soldiers establish FTA eligibility upon receipt of their CAC and are serving satisfactorily (cannot be flagged).
  - First, Soldiers must visit ArmyIgnitED website and click on "Login." This will register your CAC to ArmyIgnitED. You will only need the URL and your CAC. Update your personal info by going to My Profile at the upper right side of the dashboard. You will need to create an Education Goal and upload an Evaluated Degree Plan. To access system tutorials click the Question Mark on the upper right corner > Documents & Links > Tutorial.
  - **GRADES**: Required to be C or higher for Undergraduate courses and B or higher for Graduate courses, or recoupment will occur. Soldiers must maintain a 2.0 or 3.0 GPA.

  - Applications must be approved at least 7 days before the Start Date of each Course. www.armyignited.army.mil

- **2.** <u>Credentialing Assistance</u>: Credentialing Assistance is an additional program under Federal Tuition Assistance (FTA) which is a **federally funded** program paid directly to the vendor. *CA* is now available in upgraded Army Ignited.
  - **FUNDING LEVEL:** Federal Tuition Assistance will pay up to \$4,000 for classroom, hands-on online/blended training (and associated materials), manuals, study guides and materials, text books, processing fees, test fees, and related fees for continuing education requirements and recertification of credentials. Soldiers may use both Federal TA and Credentialing Assistance at the same time but they cannot exceed the \$4,000 limit for the fiscal year. To apply for CA go to <a href="https://www.armyignited.army.mil">www.armyignited.army.mil</a>
  - **ELIGIBILITY**: Soldier has a CAC and must be serving satisfactorily (cannot be Flagged). Soldier must have enough time remaining in service to complete credentialing course or take the exam 30 days prior to separating from the Army.
  - **PROCESS**: Soldiers will create an account in ArmyIgnitED, sign the electronic user agreement and declare a credential goal. All requests must be submitted not earlier than 90 days, but not later than 45 days, prior to start of any course/exam date. All approved fees are paid by Central Billing Office (CBO) prior to the start date of the course/exam.

The Soldier will not be reimbursed for anything paid out of pocket. ACCESS AU will notify Soldiers when their charges have been paid via a helpdesk case in ArmyIgnitED.

- 3. <u>State Tuition Reimbursement (STR) Program</u>. STR is a state funded program that reimburses up to 100% of tuition upon successful completion of the coursework, with a <u>MAXIMUM</u> yearly benefit of \$18,000.00 for Undergraduate courses and \$28,000.00 for Graduate courses. The maximum lifetime benefit is 144 Semester Credits. STR funds certificate programs, associate, bachelors, masters, and professional degree/doctorate.
  - (1) **UNDERGRADUATE RATE:** STR rate will not exceed 100% of the tuition charged by the educational institution up to 100% of the U of M Resident Undergraduate rate (\$557.55) (2) **GRADUATE RATE:** STR rate will not exceed the tuition charged by the educational institution up to 75% of the U of M Graduate School Resident General Tuition rate (\$1,194.75).
  - (3) **APPLICATION PROCEDURES:** SMs must fill out a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) before payment is processed. STR payment request form along with your fee statement and your grade slip (from your school) must be submitted to the unit full time representative no later than 90 days after the end of your course/term.

# (Eligible Soldiers MUST apply for FTA before receiving STR beginning 1 AUG 22.)

You will receive your STR payment within 30 - 45 days. If you are attending a school with shorter classes, you should still follow the traditional school semester calendar (submit for classes completed every 8-12 weeks)

### **State Tuition Reimbursement option for SPOUSES**

Spouses of Service members (SM) who are authorized to use the existing balance of a service member's STR. The spouse can use up to 12 semester credits/17 quarter credits per year (01 July through 30 June). The SM must have accumulated eight years of qualifying service in the MNNG <u>before</u> the spouse can be eligible for this benefit. Payments will be direct deposited into the SM's bank account. Payment requests will work the same for the spouse as for the SM.

# 4. GI Bill Programs -

Service members are authorized 36 months of benefits upon qualification for one of the chapters listed below. Soldiers who qualify for two or more chapters simultaneously may be authorized an additional 12 months of benefits, for a total of 48 months. Soldiers are limited to using a maximum of 36 months of benefits under a single chapter of GI Bill.

### MGIB-Selected Reserve Chapter 1606 eff: 1 OCT 2022

NOTE: A Service Member can combine the GI Bill, FTA, and STR to fund up to 100% of their tuition costs.

#### **Eligibility requirements:**

- 6 year enlistment/service obligation
- Graduate from IADT/BOLC
- High School Diploma/GED

Eligibility ends upon separation from ARNG. Soldiers who mobilized may receive an extension to use benefits equal to length of deployment +4 months

- Must elect to participate when serving a qualifying period of Active Duty (AGRs must use FTA in conjunction with CH 30 while in active status)
- \$1200.00 paid by SM to participate

Eligibility ends 10 years after last separation from Active Duty (Title 10/32). Subsequent tours reset eligibility window.

## <u>Post 9-11 GI Bill (Chapter 33) eff: 2022 Academic Year (1 AUG 22- 31 JUL 23)</u> Eligibility Requirements

- An aggregate of 90 days or more of qualifying Title 10 active duty (688; 12301a, 12301d, 12301g, 12301h, 12302 or 12304, 12304a/b) commencing on or after 11 September 2001
- An aggregate of 90 days or more of qualifying Title 32 (AGR) commencing on or after 11 SEP 01. (ADSW/ADOS time is not qualifying service.)

• SM must make an IRREVOCABLE election to convert to Post 9-11, by giving up another GI Bill benefit

Eligibility ends 15 years after last discharge from Active Duty, or no expiration date for service ending after 01 January 2013.

- Tuition and fees payment prorated based on benefit level and rate of pursuit (see above). It is also limited to the highest per credit hour tuition and the maximum fees charged by a public institution for undergraduate training in the state where the student is enrolled (state cap). Private and foreign higher education institutions are capped at \$26,381.37 per academic year effective 01 Aug 2022.
- Monthly housing allowance equal to the basic allowance for housing payable to a military E-5 with dependents, in the same zip code as your school (prorated based on method of delivery, tier percentage, and rate of pursuit i.e. full-time, half-time, etc)
- Students attending classes exclusively online receive BAH at ½ the national average MAH rate. (\$916.50 per mo.)
- Yearly books and supplies stipend of up to \$1000 per year (\$41.67 per credit prorated based on benefit tier)

#### Transfer of Post 9-11 GI Bill (Chapter 33) Benefits

- Soldiers with at least 6 years of service and eligibility for Chapter 33 can transfer unused benefits to eligible family members with a 4-year service obligation from date of transfer.
- Spouses may begin using benefits after the Soldier has served 6 years of service and may use the benefit to the Service Member's delimiting date. (15 Years before 01 January 2013, or no expiration date for service ending after 01 January 2013.)
- Dependent children may begin using benefits after the Soldier has served 10 years time in service. Eligible children must be under the age of 23 on the date of transfer. Children may use the benefit between the ages of 18 and 26.
- Dependents must be enrolled in DEERS to complete the transfer process. To transfer benefits, Soldiers must complete the application at <a href="http://milconnect.dmdc.mil">http://milconnect.dmdc.mil</a>, and select the "Transfer of Education Benefits (TEB)" link. Before the application is completed, Soldiers without a remaining four-year service obligation must extend their enlistment and notify the GI Bill Manager of the extension. All supporting documents must be processed through SIDPERS and saved in IPERMS before transfer can be approved.

NOTE: A Service Member can combine the GI Bill, FTA, and STR to fund up to 100% of their tuition costs.

**4. MINNESOTA GI BILL** – The Minnesota GI Bill program was established in 2007 to provide postsecondary financial assistance to eligible Minnesota veterans and service members as well as eligible spouses and children of deceased or severely disabled eligible Minnesota veterans. Full-time undergraduate or graduate students may be eligible to receive up to \$5,000 per year [which may be used in one term] and part-time students may be eligible to receive up to \$500 per semester or term. Maximum yearly benefit is \$5,000 per calendar year; \$15,000 lifetime benefit.

## **Eligibility Requirements**

- You must be a Minnesota resident enrolled at Minnesota Educational institution and meet one of the following additional eligibility requirements:
- Veteran who is serving or has served honorably in any branch of the United States armed forces at any time; or
- Non-veteran who has served honorably for a total of five years or more cumulatively as a member of the Minnesota National Guard or any other active or reserve component of the United States armed forces, and any part of that service occurred on or after September 11, 2001, (5 years starts at first day of basic training) or;
- Spouse or child of a person who has served in the military at any time on and who has died or has a total and permanent disability as a direct result of that military service. (Student must also be eligible to receive federal veteran's education benefits as a spouse or dependent.)
