

Outreach & Coordination Landowners, Partnerships

Coordination between Camp Ripley Sentinel Landscape (CRSL) partners and landowner outreach is essential to implementing the Landscape Strategies that are targeted to privately owned lands.

ACUB Land Protection Easements & Acquisitions The goal of the Army Compatible Use Buffer (ACUB) Agreement Area is to protect lands for the military mission of Camp Ripley while also protecting and enhancing working lands, natural resources, habitat, and climate resilience.

Protections & Management Best Management Practices

The CRSL aims to "sustain farms and forests," and work with partner agencies to implement Best Management Practices (BMPs) in working lands and permanent protection of forested and sensitive lands to benefit surface water, groundwater, and habitat quality.
